Resource Directory of Forensic Psychology Pre-doctoral Internships Training Programs

This directory includes a listing of pre-doctoral internships offering training opportunities in forensic psychology. Like the previous edition, the current directory contains information about forensic rotations including: setting, population, type of forensic assessment and treatment experiences, as well as time spent at each training experience. Email and website addresses have been included to facilitate contact with internship programs.

Updating this directory involved several steps. First, internships offering major or minor rotations in forensic psychology were identified through a search of the Association of Psychology Postdoctoral and Internship Centers (APPIC) online directory. Second, emails with links to a web-based questionnaire were sent to training directors requesting their participation in updating the directory. The directory was updated based on the information provided by the training directors. Finally, a draft copy of the directory was placed on the web and the training directors who responded to the questionnaire were invited to review the information and request changes if needed.

The directory was produced by Alvin Malesky and Allison Croysdale from Western Carolina University. Support for this project came from the American Psychology-Law Society (APLS). Additional Information about this Rotation: This placement provides experience in the evaluation of children ages two to 18 years old, which are identified as possibly either sexually abused, physically abused or neglected, and whose parents are involved in dependency court proceedings. All evaluations conducted by interns are provided through an order of the court and address the cognitive, social, and emotional needs of the child, including attachment issues. These evaluations assist the court in making decisions regarding the child's primary psychological relationships, unmet developmental requirements that a parent figure needs to be capable of fulfilling, and recommended educational and mental health interventions. The evaluations do not address the veracity of maltreatment allegations, nor do they provide recommendations regarding separation from or reunification with the biological family. This placement provides interns the opportunity to work with a culturally diverse population and become familiar with the structure of the child welfare system. Interns may observe forensic interviews of children at the Child Justice Center and other Dependency Division hearings, including those pertaining to emergency shelter, arraignments, judicial reviews, contested adjudication of dependency, and termination of parental rights. Interns are also welcome to attend the Hillsborough County Guardian ad Litem lecture series where the court system is explained and issues related to child maltreatment are examined. Interns also learn about ways in which psychologists work with attorneys. For instance if the intern is deposed, the psychologist supervisor along with attorneys will prepare the intern for testifying and providing the deposition.

Additional Information about this Rotation: The program offered for intern training at ZCI is called Modality II, a residential substance abuse treatment program for inmates with co-occurring mental health and substance abuse disorders. The Modality II program operates as a 139 bed, modified therapeutic community model of substance abuse treatment. Treatment typically lasts 12 months, and is targeted toward inmates who are within two years of release. The treatment model emphasizes experiential learning, modifying criminal thinking errors, accountability to other treatment participants and the larger therapeutic community, responsibility for self and others, and the conscious decision to make major life changes. The program is structured into four phases of treatment: orientation, skill-building, relapse prevention and maintenance, and community transition. Group treatment and individual counseling are provided. Interns gain practical, supervised experience in the treatment of substance abuse through participation in community meetings, facilitating didactic psychoeducational groups, co-leading process groups, and providing individual cognitive-behavior therapy. Interns also learn about the many ethical and legal issues pertaining to the provision of substance abuse treatment services within a prison setting.

Additional Information about this Rotation: This residential program involves comprehensive treatment of the convicted offender using an Integrative model that includes strong Cognitive - Behavioral and Relapse Prevention components. Participants referred from throughout the Mid-Atlantic Region proceed through a state of the art, planned treatment program. Implemented as a therapeutic community, it emphasizes personal accountability and decision-making, as well as the connection of substance abuse to faulty/criminal patterns of thought and action that affect other areas of the participants' lives. Confrontation plays a primary role during the initial orientation phase of treatment; this is followed by a second phase focusing on treatment and change and includes a wide range of interventions; the last phase of the program is called transitional care, and emphasizes adjusting to being drug free. Those completing the program are subject to required post-release supervision, and aftercare is planned by program staff. The National Institute for Drug Abuse maintains an ongoing research program to evaluate the program's efficacy. Given the high base rate for substance abuse in any population, this is a valuable training opportunity.

Additional Information about this Rotation: This rotation provides interns the opportunity to work with inmates who present with psychophysiological disorders, psychological factors affecting their physical conditions, and/or physical conditions which have psychological sequelae. Interns serve as a consultant when psychological factors are adversely affecting engagement in or compliance with medical care, and work in concert with Health Services staff (physicians, physician assistants, physical therapists, dietician, nurses and social worker) to identify, diagnose and treat inmates for whom the interplay of physical and psychological factors is significant. Interns may provide group and individual treatment for inmates with psychophysiological disorders, including essential hypertension, chronic pain, tension and migraine headaches, anxiety disorders, etc., and inmates with terminal or severely debilitating chronic diseases, such as AIDS, cancer and heart disease. Individual therapy patients are selected through routine intake assessment procedures. Additional Information that Enhances Clinical-Forensic Training:

The Complex provides a broad spectrum of services to over 3400 adult inmates, including a general correctional population of approximately 2400 men (500 inmates at the FCI, 300 individuals in the adjoining minimum security camp, 300 as part of the FMC Work Cadre, and another 1300 at the LSCI), 300 medical and 300 psychiatric inpatient beds; a 200 bed Residential Drug Abuse Treatment Program, a 108 bed Sex Offender Treatment Program, a Habilitation Program with 16 individuals in phase I and up to 12 in Phase II, 84 individuals in the psychiatric step-down unit, and a 20 bed unit for predatory, hypersexual inmates, and an additional medium/high security institution is currently under construction. Psychology Services is crucial to operations in all of these areas. Interns participate in three different service areas appropriate to the emphasis of the track for which they match. Interns at this site develop the essential skills for a Staff Psychologist in a mainstream correctional facility by completing a minimum of 500 hours of direct experience in a General Practice rotation, including general population and non-residential drug abuse treatment functions. These experiences are obtained with general inmate populations at one of the complex facilities under the direct supervision of staff with primary responsibility as unit psychologist. Typical intern duties mirror those of entry-level staff, including completion of intake screenings, group and individual psychotherapy, crisis intervention, suicide risk assessment, and consultation with medical and psychiatric staff and members of unit teams. Beyond the foundational experiences noted above, interns receive training in one residential treatment program and one inpatient treatment service. Typical experiences in residential programs include group and individual therapy, intake assessments tailored to the program, large therapeutic community group meetings, team-based treatment planning, implementation of a standard program curriculum, and participation in discipline and motivation for program participants. Applied activities in inpatient services include monitoring treatment compliance, collaboration with medical and psychiatric staff, directing paraprofessionals such as nurses and technicians, and completing elaborate psychological evaluation reports for the courts. Skills practiced in general population areas, unit-based treatment programs, and inpatient settings are not mutually exclusive. Group and individual treatment is offered across the board. Assessment of risk for suicide, and for violent acting out or other threat to security, is of interest with all inmate populations. Interns regularly assist in facilitating the outpatient psychiatry medication clinic at the FCI, in addition to gaining experience in psychopharmacology at the FMC. Extensive psychological evaluations take place in each of the residential programs as well as on the inpatient mental health service. Medical patients are found in every inmate group throughout the complex, not just in the inpatient medical units. Practicing pertinent skills in more than one work area reinforces an integrated view of the complex needs of clients and of psychology services in this setting.

The NC General Assembly created the FTP specifically to house all patients who have been found Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity on violent charges. NGRI (NC GS 15A-1321) patients are automatically committed to the FTP. These patients will typically have a very lengthy hospitalization, because the law requires that they prove they are no longer dangerous, and to do so in a court in the county that brought their original charge. In order to make a smooth transition to the community, the FTP treatment teams help them work through a graduated series of privilege levels that allow them to demonstrate lack of dangerousness in increasingly self-reliant situations. Discharges to the community are always determined by court decisions. Most FTP patients have been committed on the legal status of having been found to be not capable to proceed on a violent criminal charge, as well as being dangerous due to a mental disorder or defect (NC GS 15A-1003). For patients who have been found not capable to proceed to trial, the focus of the FTP is to help them restore their capacity to proceed, so they can be discharged to jail to resolve their legal situation. A small number of patients are admitted to the FTP who do not have legal status ("exception" patients). These patients are referred from other hospital units because of unmanageable behavior in less secure or structured units. The treatment goals of the FTP are to help the patient gain behavioral control for return to the referring unit or hospital. Some Exception patients may be discharged to the community directly from the FTP. The patient population at the FTP is primarily psychotic disorders, frequently with co-morbid mental retardation, substance abuse and/or characterological disorders. Interns placed in the FTP will participate in treatment team meetings, individual therapy intended to restore capacity to proceed, group therapy for capacity restoration in the Psychosocial rehabilitation "mall," behavioral analysis and behavioral intervention, evaluation of patients for restoration of capacity to proceed, and participation in court hearings.

Additional Information about this Rotation: The Pre-Trial Evaluation Center is the only centralized facility in North Carolina for evaluation of a pre-trial defendant's capacity to proceed to trial. Many such evaluations are accomplished by local forensic screeners, but complex or high profile cases are typically referred to the Pre-Trial Evaluation Center. The Center is the only state supported facility for defendants referred for evaluation of criminal responsibility (insanity defense). The Center performs approximately 750 evaluations each year. The patient population at the Pre-Trial Unit covers the full range of psychopathology, although characterological and substance abuse disorders are common. Typical length of stay is 10 days. Assessments of patients referred from the Pre-Trial Center typically involve questions of diagnosis, intellectual impairment, cognitive impairment and/or malingering. A combination of formal assessment methods (diagnostic interviewing, Rorschach, MMPI-2, WAIS-III and achievement testing) and in-depth review of available documentation (medical and psychiatric records, school records, previous evaluations, criminal records, forensic evidence, etc.) is required. Assessment of possible malingering will typically utilize specific malingering instruments (Structured Interview for Reported Symptoms, Test of Memory Malingering, Rey 15-item recall, variations of Forced Choice testing). Some neuropsychological screening (RBANS and/or CERAD) and brief intellectual testing (WASI) will also be needed. Forensic Assessment can be taken as a one day per week "minor" rotation or a 3 day per week "major" rotation. It is supervision intensive, including considerable attention to report writing for use in court. Interns have the opportunity to accompany the supervising psychologist to court and observe testimony. In rare cases, interns may be called to testify. It is the policy of the Forensics Division that, in those rare cases, interns should be presented as "fact" witnesses rather than as "expert" witnesses.

Additional Information about this Rotation: The Health Sciences Centre (HSC) and/or Selkirk Mental Health Centre (SMHC) provide the opportunity for psychology residents to have clinical contact with forensic psychiatric patients. These are individuals with major mental disorders (Schizophrenia, Bipolar Disorder, etc.) who have come into contact with the criminal justice system for a variety of offences, ranging in severity from the most violent offences (e.g., murder) to less serious offences (e.g., Mischief). These individuals, in addition to suffering from severe and persistent mental illnesses, also have a number of comorbid conditions, such as substance abuse, cognitive disability, poverty, etc. They are typically first assessed at HSC due to questions surrounding their competency (or fitness) to stand trial or because there are questions about their level of responsibility for their criminal behavior due to their mental disorder. Many long-term patients have been found Not Criminally Responsible on account of Mental Disorder (NCRMD) and are being treated in hospital or in the community, thus bringing them into regular contact with clinical staff at both sites.
